Detailed Monthly information for the month of July, 2022

Important Policy decisions taken and major achievements during the month:

MINISTRY OF CIVIL AVIATION

- 1. Deoghar airport was inaugurated by Hon'ble Prime Minister on 12.07.2022 with inaugural flight from Deoghar to Kolkata.
- 2. AAI Cargo Logistics and Allied Services Company Limited (AAICLAS) commenced movement of Domestic Air Cargo through Domestic Passenger terminal at Tezpur Airport on 28.07.2022.
- 3. AAICLAS received Regulated Agent (RA) status for Guwahati airport on 01.07.2022 and approval for RA at domestic Air Cargo Terminal, Port Blair airport on 13.07.2022.
- 4. As on 31.07.2022, ten (10) Aircraft leasing entities have been registered with International Financial Services Centers Authority (IFSCA).
- 5. Ministry of Civil Aviation has formed a Monitoring Committee vide Order dated 15.07.2022 for the implementation of Regional Transport Aircraft (RTA) project under the Co-chairmanship of Secretary, Civil Aviation and Secretary, Department of Scientific and Industrial Research (DSIR).
- 6. Passengers carried by domestic airlines during Jan-June 2022 were 572.49 lakhs as against 343.37 lakhs during the corresponding period of previous year thereby registering annual growth of 66.73% and monthly growth of 237.65%.
- 7. 01 airport and 02 new RCS routes commenced in the month of July, 2022.
- 8. 344 Drones were registered and Unique Identification Number (UIN) were issued for them in the month of July, 2022.
- 9. 222 Remote Pilot certificates were issued in the month of July, 2022.

10. The Ministry of Civil Aviation conducted "Mission Karmayogi- Immersive Training" programme for the first batch of its employees from 4th to 8th July, 2022.

TRAFFIC TREND:

Monthly Traffic Reporter for the month of June, 2022 has been prepared and uploaded on AAI website. The broad highlights of Traffic Reporter for the month of June, 2022 and (April–June) 2022-23 are as follows:-

JUNE, 2022 - During the month of June, 2022, all Indian airports taken together handled 204.27 thousand aircraft movements (excluding General Aviation Movements), 25.28 million passengers and 270.40 thousand tonnes of freight.

(APRIL- JUNE) 2022-23 - During the period of April – June 2022-23, all Indian airports taken together handled 613.57 thousand aircraft movements (excluding General Aviation Movements), 76.47 million passengers and 810.67 thousand tonne of freight.

A. Airports Council International – Airport Service Quality (ACI-ASQ) Survey

During July, 2022, ACI-ASQ survey at 13 AAI airports was conducted successfully.

HOTEL CORPORATION OF INDIA LTD (HCI)

A. The performance of the Company in July, 2022 has improved substantially with a Revenue of Rs 3.85 crore against Rs 1.85 crore in July 2021 i.e. an increase of 108% over the previous year.

ALLIANCE AIR AVIATION LTD.
