- (iii) 'AAI Connect', the quarterly newsletter of AAI has been launched on 31st July 2017. With the newsletter, AAI management is aiming to bring to light various activities in and around all its regions, airports and establishments, there by handing it even more visibility among its internal and external public.
- (iv) Futuristic IT network planned and implemented at Vadodara Airport making it capable of becoming a smart airport.
- (v) Successfully organized bidding process for inviting proposals from Airline operators by implementation of e-bidding portal through MSTC for Regional Connectivity Scheme (RCS) under UDAN initiative of MoCA.
- (vi) To give faster access to airports the bandwidth for 72 airports upgraded successfully. Bandwidth for 29 airports has been doubled and for 43 airports it has been tripled.
