Detailed Monthly information for the month of February, 2021

Important Policy decisions taken and major achievements during the month:

1. MINISTRY OF CIVIL AVIATION

A. After review of the current status of Scheduled domestic operations viz-a-viz passenger demand for air travel, this Ministry vide order No. 1312021 has extended the opening of the sector in a calibrated manner till 31.03.2021 or till the date of commencement of Summer Schedule 2021, whichever is earlier or until further orders.

Further, this Ministry vide order No. 14/2021 dated 11.02.2021 has increased the lower band of fares on all sectors by 10% and the upper band of fares on all sectors by 30%.

- **B. PASSENGER GROWTH:** Passengers carried by domestic airlines during Jan 2021 were 77.34 lakhs as against 127.83 lakhs during the corresponding period of previous year.
- C. 06 new RCS routes has been operationalized in the month of February, 2021.
- **D.** Government of India, in exercise of the powers conferred under Rule 160 of the Aircraft Rules, 1937, has granted conditional exemption from the provisions of the Rule 15A to the following entities:
 - a. BCCI for aerial cinematography of the India Cricket Session in 2021 using drones.
 - b. Kochi Metro Rail Ltd. for Integrated Urban Regeneration and Water Transport System (IURWTS) project using drones.
 - c. Ministry of Agriculture & Farmers' Welfare (MoAFW) for remote sensing data collection in agricultural area under Pradhan Mantri Fasal Bima Yojana (PMFBY) using drones.
- E. 362 Drone Acknowledgement Numbers (DAN) issued in the month of February, 2021.
- F. Aircraft Leasing and Financing Ecosystem: Draft Regulations were drawn up by International Financial Services Authority (IFSCA) in one-on-one consultations with MoCA for enabling aircraft leasing and financing from GIFT-City IFSC, and circulated for wider public consultations. Ministry of Civil Aviation organized India Aircraft Leasing Summit in collaboration with IFSC Authority, GIFT- City and FICCI on 26/02/2021 at Vigyan Bhavan, New Delhi. Smt. Nirmala Sitharaman, Union Finance Minister was the Chief Guest and graced the event with virtual presence. Shri

Hardeep S Puri, was the Guest of Honour at the summit. Shri Pradeep Singh Kharola, Secretary, Ministry of Civil Aviation, Shri Injeti Srinivas, Chairperson, International Financial Services Centre Authority, Ms. Vandana Aggarwal, Senior Economic Advisor, M/o Civil Aviation, Shri Uday Shankar, President, FICCI, Shri Remi Maillard, Head of Airbus India, and stakeholders from the Indian civil aviation sector and industry members attended the event. Civil Aviation Minister highlighted that aircraft financing is the most profitable segment of the aviation value chain and currently, foreign financiers and lessors are the biggest beneficiaries of India's growing opportunity. He informed that several initiatives have been taken by the Government to develop Aviation leasing and Financing Hub in India which included Financing, MRO, manufacturing etc. to rapidly expand this business in India.

G. Air Cargo: Near normalization of **92**% of air cargo handled in India has been achieved in January 2021 as compared to January 2020 taking the totals for domestic and international cargo. In February 2021, as per initial estimates, the improvement is upto **95**% normalization.

H. Krishi Udaan – Airlifting agri-produce for better value realisation for farmers:

i. Total tonnage of agri-perishables handled in the 11 months of FY 2020-21 ending on 28 February 2021 was 1,27,654 MT. The movement of perishables from North Eastern Region during the month was 1535 MT.

JANUARY, 2021

During the month of January, 2021, all Indian airports taken together handled 159.23 thousand aircraft movements (excluding General Aviation Movements), 16.73 million passengers and 245.32 thousand tonnes of freight.

(APRIL- JANUARY) 2020-21

During the period of April – January 2020-21, all Indian airports taken together handled 876.86 thousands of aircrafts movements (excluding General Aviation Movements), 81.56 million passengers and 1946.53 thousand tonnes of freight.
