Detailed Monthly information for the month of January, 2019

Important Policy decisions taken and major achievements during the month:

1. Ministry of Civil Aviation

- A. Passengers carried by domestic airlines during Jan-Dec, 2018 were <u>1389.76 lakhs</u> as against <u>1171.76 lakhs</u> during the corresponding period of previous year thereby registering a growth of <u>18.60%</u>
- B. Meeting of Haj Air Travel Committee was held on 24.01.2019 to open the bids in response to the Tender Document dated 24.12.2018 and corrigendum dated 17.01.2019 for selection of airlines for Haj Air Charter Operation 2019.
- C. Project Rupee Raftaar: Aircraft/Engines Financing and Leasing from India: Formulated a road map for developing an aircraft financing and leasing ecosystem in India. Indian airline carriers have the world's third largest firm order book of around 1,000 aircraft after the US and China. The Working Group set up by the Ministry of Civil Aviation has submitted its Report, which was released at the Global Aviation Summit at Mumbai on 15.01.2019.
- D. <u>National Air Cargo Policy Outline 2019</u> released at the Global Aviation Summit at Mumbai on 15.01.2019. It outlines a globally unique, holistic approach to achieve fundamental re-engineering in the air cargo ecosystem in order to upscale the Indian air cargo network to provide cargo transportation by air to the masses at an affordable cost and connect every village to the national and global value chains. Its focus areas are as follows:
 - Regulatory Policies in Support of Air Cargo Growth
 - Air Cargo Market Strategy and Development Strategy
 - Security Strategy
 - Safety Strategy
 - Cargo Community Infrastructure
 - Technology and Innovation
 - Sustainability
 - Human Capital Development
 - Performance Benchmarking
- E. Mission Statement for developing India as the Next-Gen Aviation Hub was released at the Global Aviation Summit at Mumbai on 16.01.2019. It outlines the strategic elements for enhancing the airport capacity equal to 100 airports in the next 15 years and for promoting and encouraging some of them to serve as global aviation hubs in India, including by leveraging the strength of India's domestic carriers in non-stop direct flights, building strong Indian global airlines, and developing airport terminals and flight schedules that enable and facilitate passenger transfers.

F. National Green Aviation Policy

The ministry of civil aviation government of India is committed to inclusive and sustainable growth of the civil aviation sector in the country while mitigating its

negative impact on the environment at the same time. The vision document sets out a strategic framework to address the major environmental challenges of the aviation industry it comprehends the key environmental issues of the sector and emphasizes the governments approach towards environment protection.

G. Drone Ecosystem Policy Roadmap

After the launch of the Digital Sky Platform under Civil Aviation Regulations ("CAR") 1.0 with effect from December 1, 2018, a basic framework for regulations has been established. The focus now has been on addressing challenging frontier issues such as Beyond Visual Line of Sight ("BVLOS") & Autonomous Operations. Ministry of Civil Aviation constituted a task-force on the recommendation for CAR 2.0 under the chairmanship of Hon'ble Minister of State for Civil Aviation. Pursuant to responsibilities handed over to the sub-committee on Regulations and Policy, a draft policy note on CAR 2.0 along with recommendations was presented in the drone ecosystem roadmap. Key principles were recommend that should guide the drafting of the CAR 2.0. The basic tenet being that no operation should be allowed over civilian airspace unless manufacturers meet certain standards, and operators prove safety of all stakeholders in designated test zones. Further, even after such demonstrations, operations are only allowed in well-defined Drone Corridors. The regime of No Permission, No Take-off ("NPNT") will continue in CAR 2.0, to provide security from unauthorized rights. For privacy, manufacturers will be required to adhere to a privacy by design standard, eliminating risks of future privacy harms by operators. Overall, the CAR 2.0 enables innovation without significantly compromising safety, security or privacy.

H. Vision 2040 for the Civil Aviation Industry in India

The document highlights the aviation stakeholders' perspective and the growth potential in different sub-sectors such as airlines, airports, air cargo, MRO, ground handling, aviation security, aviation safety, Human resource development, general aviation, aeronautical manufacturing, air navigation system of Indian aviation and the key action steps required thereof.
