### **Detailed Monthly information for the month of March, 2019**

Important Policy decisions taken and major achievements during the month:

### 1. <u>Ministry of Civil Aviation</u>

- A. Passengers carried by domestic airlines during Jan, 2019 were <u>238.56</u> <u>lakhs</u> as against <u>229.09 lakhs</u> during the corresponding period of previous year thereby registering a growth of <u>7.42%</u>
- **B.** International Women's Day on 08<sup>th</sup> March 2019 was celebrated in each region of Air India limited by organizing special programmes for women employees consisting of Health talks, motivational programs, Time and Stress Management, Women empowerment, sexual Harassment at work place etc. Approx. 1000 women employees had actively participated on all India basis.
- **C.** Govt. has released Rs.1300 crore to Special Purpose Vehicle (SPV) (namely Air India Assets Holding Ltd.) to meet the interest for Q3/Q4 of FY 2018-19 on the debt transferred to SPV vide this Ministry's order dated 20.03.209.

#### G. TRAFFIC TREND:

### FEBRUARY, 2019 VIS-À-VIS FEBRUARY, 2018

The aircraft movement, passenger and freight traffic have increased by 4.9 percent, 4.5 percent and 3.1 percent respectively at all Indian airports taken together during February, 2019 over February, 2018.

(APRIL – FEBRUARY) 2018-19 VIS-À-VIS (APRIL – FEBRUARY) 2017-18
Aircraft Movements: The international and domestic aircraft movements have witnessed an increase of 3.8 percent and 15.6 percent respectively resulting into 13.3 percent increase in total aircraft movements during (April – February) 2018-19 as compared to (April - February) 2017-18.

<u>Passengers</u>: The international and domestic passengers traffic have shown an increase of 6.7 percent and 14.6 percent respectively resulting into overall increase of 12.9 percent in total passenger traffic during the period (April-February) 2018-19 as compared to (April-February) 2017-18.

<u>Freight</u>: The international and domestic freight traffic have shown growth of 2.9 percent and 12.7 percent respectively resulting into overall increase of 6.4 percent in total freight traffic during the period (April- February) 2018-19 as compared to (April- February) 2017-18.
